

Emergency Preparedness

Public health has critical responsibilities related to all hazards including those natural, technological, and man-made. The department manages the Strategic National Stockpile (SNS) which provides additional medical countermeasures to local emergency responders including public health during a disaster. The SNS medical supplies also support public health's efforts to provide medications during disease outbreaks. Public health works closely with emergency responders to keep our community safe.



Vital Records

Person County Health Department serves as the Registrar for vital records and assures all births, deaths, and fetal deaths occurring in the county are properly registered.

Person County Health Department and its employees are prohibited from discriminating against clients for any reason, such as but not limited to, age, sex, race, color, creed, religion, national origin, disability, education, ethnicity, socioeconomic status, sexual orientation, gender identity, sex characteristics, number of pregnancies, marital status, ability to pay, and/or method of payment.

We care for the men, women & children of our community by providing comprehensive services focused on wellness, education, and prevention.

Condoms are available free of charge at the front desk and can be obtained without an appointment on a walk-in basis, without having to be seen by a nurse or doctor.

Family Planning Program

The Family Planning Program serves to enable men and women to understand their sexuality, determine the number and spacing of their children, and prevent unwanted pregnancies. Services include patient education, risk prevention, physical exams, laboratory testing, Pap smears, and methods of birth control.

Maternal Health Program



The Maternal Health Program offers complete maternity care to pregnant women with financial limitations. Services include physical examinations, laboratory tests, prenatal education, and the provision of prenatal vitamins.

Women, Infants & Children (WIC)

The WIC Program provides supplemental food and nutrition education for women, infants, and children (under five) who are at nutritional risk. WIC also provides breastfeeding support. This institution is an equal opportunity provider.

Care Management for At Risk Children (CMARC)



CMARC is a free program to help families improve the health outcomes of their children from birth to 5 years of age. The program strives to connect families with services; support families with children to reach their developmental potential; and ensure that children have healthy, safe, and nurturing environments.

Immunization Program

The Immunization Program provides adult and childhood immunizations to control and prevent diseases.

Communicable Disease Program

The Communicable Disease Program is responsible for preventing and controlling the spread of diseases. The Communicable Disease Nurse works with Person County Animal Services and veterinarians to provide services related to rabies exposure. This program also includes education, investigation, treatment, and follow-up of communicable diseases such as Tuberculosis, Hepatitis, foodborne illnesses, etc.

Sexually Transmitted Infection (STI) Program

The STI Program is responsible for the direct delivery of free STI and HIV prevention and control services. These services include providing clinical services, STI testing, education and awareness for men and women, and monitoring disease trends.

Care Management for High Risk Pregnancies (CMHRP)

CMHRP is a care management service provided for pregnant recipients who are identified to be at risk for poor birth outcomes and meet program requirements. It helps pregnant women obtain needed services to improve the quality of maternity care, improve birth outcomes, and provide continuity of care.



Health Education

Health Education provides educational opportunities and resources to help Personians make informed decisions about their health. Health Education is also responsible for assessing and addressing county health needs with partners, as well as coordinating agency accreditation, Healthy Personians, etc.

Environmental Health

Environmental Health is responsible for providing services that protect and promote public health. Services include food and lodging inspections, the design and inspection of onsite wastewater disposal systems, the inspection and monitoring of private water supplies, and the investigation of environmental health complaints.
