March is Developmental Disabilities Month

In 1987, President Ronald Regan proclaimed March "Developmental Disabilities Awareness Month." The deinstitutionalization movement of the seventies and early eighties had laid the foundation for significant social change, and the presidential proclamation called upon Americans to provide the "encouragement and opportunities" necessary for people with developmental disabilities to reach their potential.

As people with disabilities began living within the general community in larger numbers, programs to provide career planning, job coaching, and supported employment began to emerge. The idea that individuals with developmental disabilities could become productive members of the workforce was new to many people, and entrenched preconceptions had to be overcome. Advocates recognized a moral imperative to engage individuals with developmental and other disabilities. Then came the passage of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) in 1990, prohibiting discrimination and guaranteeing people with disabilities the same opportunities as everyone else to participate in the mainstream of American life—to enjoy employment opportunities, to purchase goods and services, and to participate in state and local government programs and services.

The expectations of young people with developmental disabilities and their parents began to shift. Productive, self-directed lives within the community increasingly became the goal. At the same time, due to improvements in healthcare, people with developmental disabilities were living longer. The national conversation began to address the full spectrum of services needed for people with disabilities to live secure, fulfilling lives. Passage of the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) in 2004 further cemented the resolve of self-advocates and their supporters. IDEA opened world of possibilities with its guarantees of early intervention, special education, and services to transition high schoolers into adulthood.

During the month of March, all individuals, agencies, and organizations are encouraged to observe this month by increasing public awareness of the needs and potential of Americans with disabilities. It is also an opportunity to promote respect for people with intellectual and developmental disabilities and to educate others on the

spectrum of abilities that individuals possess. Finally, March should be used to create awareness about developmental disabilities and teach the importance of inclusion within every aspect of life.

In celebration of Developmental Disabilities Month, please join Person Industries as we continue to strive to educate others and spread awareness about this important topic. Wear orange. Orange is a color symbolizing energy and positivity. It's also the official color of Developmental Disabilities Awareness Month.
