Yin Yoga

The class will be taught by Martha Pickett, who has over 200 hours of training in yin yoga. While “yang” yoga focuses on your muscles, yin yoga targets your deep connective tissues, like your fascia, ligaments, joints, and bones. It's slower and more meditative, giving you space to turn inward and tune into both your mind and the physical sensations of your body. Because you're holding poses for a longer period of time than you would in other traditional types of yoga, yin yoga helps you stretch and lengthen those rarely-used tissues while also teaching you how to breathe through discomfort and sit with your thoughts.

No experience is necessary. Come and see how yoga can be part of your daily health routine. There is a minimum of four for the class to run.

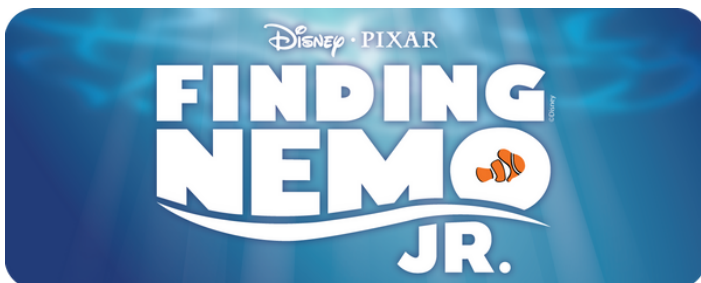

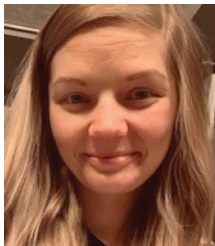

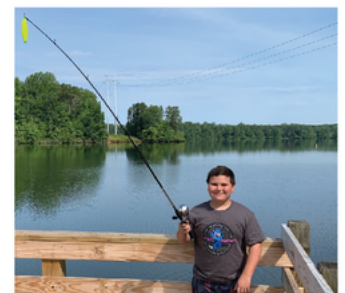

County Farm Park Update

Development is underway as all of the necessary permits have been obtained to move forward with the engineered plans for the County Farm Park project. We are excited to see the plans come to life starting with the bidding process that is currently underway with certain trail amenities. This includes front road access to the park. The Firebreak trail is currently under construction, but will begin and end at the parking lot. The trail will follow the property boundary, along portions of the North Flat River, and the Flat River. The trail will be multi-use, with access to biking, running and hiking. As you travel along the trail, you will see the remnants of the original plowed fire breaks from the early years of the property.

Once along the North Flat, you will encounter several stands of Mountain Laurel and wonderful views of rock outcroppings along the hillsides and in the river. With 281 acres, there will be additional trails built in phases within the interior of the park.
